



Recently, I had lunch with a friend, and she asked me, "What is Advent again? I get it mixed up with Lent."

"Advent is the four weeks before Christmas," I replied.

"Oh yeah, that's right," she said. "It's that time when you wait, expecting something great and you are hopeful."

That's it in a nutshell, isn't it? Waiting, expecting, hoping. A perfect description of Mary and her cousin Elizabeth, who were both waiting, expecting and hopeful.

With the beginning of this Advent season, there may be heard a sigh of relief and a prayer of thanks for again having a permanent pastor. Three years ago, our former pastor retired. An interim period started with his departure, and the search for a new pastor began. The word interim implies a time of searching and uncertainty. We humans yearn for permanence, which promises stability and security. However, we are grateful that our interim time was well spent. To be honest, during that period our interim minister, Dr. Sharon Graff, opened our eyes to many new experiences. Without them, we would not be what we are today. She coached and coaxed us to pick up our roots, move into the here and now, and begin to plan our future. After the Search Committee had found our new settled pastor, we said farewell to our interim minister. For the few weeks that followed, it seemed to many of us that time had stood still. But our assistant pastors, the well-trained office staff, as well as various boards and committees kept the church running at the normal pace.

Now that we have explored the congregation's unusual problems, let's take a look at the complex situation a pastor faces. Whereas we have to get acquainted with just one stranger, Pastor Liz has the task of getting to know almost 200 different personalities. Everybody is eager to make personal contact with a few friendly words. This may not be so daunting in a denomination with exacting rules, but in the friendly UCC we invite everybody to join, wherever you are on your life's journey. While all member churches observe the same basic rules of the UCC, each congregation decides many issues independently. Consequently, each church has its own highly individual character that must be studied and understood to guarantee good communication and warm interaction with all members, whatever their needs may be.

There is so much more. We haven't even touched the "normal" pastoral duties. For example, there are baptisms, weddings, funerals, Sunday services with sermons, counseling members with problems, hospital visits, special ceremonies for holy days, Association and other meetings. The list goes on and on. Maybe even singing in the choir? It seems impossible that all these jobs can be done working 50 hours a week. Then there is much to learn about the day-by-day administration of a church. Even with a well-run organization, many situations occur that require a pastor's knowledgeable input. It is easy to see that a pastor's work can be very stressful. Just reading about some of the details of Pastor Liz's work can make us feel overwhelmed. I am certain all of us want to do our part to make our new pastor's settling in as pleasant as possible. With God's help we can accomplish that job by being the friendly congregation that we have always been.

This will be my last Christmas Meditation—until 2019—it is from a 2009 email:

#### **Letter from Jesus about Christmas**

It has come to my attention that many of you are upset that folks are taking My name out of the season. Maybe you've forgotten that I wasn't actually born during this time of the year, and that it was some of your predecessors who decided to celebrate My birthday on what was actually a time of pagan festival. Although I do appreciate being remembered any time.

How I feel about this celebration can be understood by those of you who have been blessed with children. I don't care what you call the day. If you want to celebrate My birth, just GET ALONG AND LOVE ONE ANOTHER.

Does it bother you that the town where you live doesn't allow a Nativity Scene in the town square? Just put one on your own front yard. If all My followers did that, there would be no need for one on the town square.

Don't worry if people call the tree a holiday tree instead of a Christmas tree. It was I who made all trees—remember Me any time you see a tree. Decorate a grape vine if you wish: I actually spoke of that one in explaining who I am in relation to you, and what each of our tasks were. In case you have forgotten, look up John 15:1-8.

If you'd like to give Me a present to remember My Birth, here is My wish list—choose one:

Instead of writing protest letters objecting to the way My Birthday is being celebrated, write letters of love and hope to soldiers away from home. They are afraid and lonely this time of year. I know, they tell Me all the time.

Visit someone in a nursing home. They need to know someone cares about them.

Instead of giving your children a lot of gifts you can't afford and they don't need, spend time with them. Tell them the story of My birth, and why I came to live with you. Hold them in your arms and remind them that I love them.

Pick someone who has hurt you in the past and forgive him or her.

Someone in your town will attempt to commit suicide this season because they feel so alone and hopeless. Since you don't know who that is, give everyone you meet a warm smile; it could make a difference.

There are families and individuals in your town who not only will not have a Christmas tree, they won't have any presents to give or receive. If you don't know them, buy some food and a few gifts and give them to the Salvation Army or other charity which believes in Me and they will make the delivery for you.

If you want to make a statement about your belief in and loyalty to Me, then behave like a Christian. Don't do things in secret that you wouldn't do in My presence. Let people know by your actions that you are one of mine.

Don't forget: I am God and can take care of Myself. Just love me and do what I have told you to do. I'll take care of all the rest. Check out the list above and get to work; time is short. I'll help you, but the ball is now in your court. And do have a most blessed Christmas with all those whom you love and remember.
