Don't forget: Shrove Tuesday Feb. 21 Pancakes/ Parsonage 5pm

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What is Shrove Tuesday?

It is the day before Ash Wednesday. Though named for its former religious significance, it is chiefly marked by feasting and celebration, which traditionally preceded the observance of the Lenten Fast.

The word **shrove** is a form of the English word shrive, which **means** to obtain absolution for one's sins by way of Confession and doing penance. Thus, **Shrove Tuesday** was named after the custom of Christians to be "shriven" before the start of Lent.

Is Shrove Tuesday the same as Fat Tuesday? YES Mardi Gras (/ˈmɑːrdi ˌgrɑː/), or **Fat Tuesday**, refers to events of the Carnival celebration, beginning on or after the Christian feasts of the Epiphany (Three Kings Day) and culminating on the day before Ash Wednesday (known as **Shrove Tuesday**).

Shrove Tuesday (also known in Commonwealth countries and Ireland as Pancake Tuesday or Pancake Day) is the day in February or March immediately preceding Ash Wednesday (the first day of Lent), which is celebrated in some countries by consuming pancakes. Shrove Tuesday came about so Christians wouldn't be wasting food during Lent. Traditionally many different foods would be given up 'meat, fish, eggs and milky foods, they were all cooked up so they wouldn't be wasted or spoiled during the 40 days of Lent. Flour was added to the mix and pancakes were born.

This year we will celebrate Shrove Tuesday along with our brothers and sisters in the UCC who came from the E & R background—Evangelical and Reformed. When Rev. Victoria was in Seminary in Pennsylvania, she first experienced Shrove Tuesday. She is inviting the whole church to a Shrove Tuesday pancake supper at the parsonage on February 21, Shrove Tuesday, for pancake supper. Would the cooks please arrive with your skillets at 4:30 pm. Then all whose name begins with A-M please arrive at 5:00 pm and all those whose names begin with N-Z arrive at 5:30 pm. Bring your favorite syrup or some fresh fruit all cut up and ready to eat.
